1. The Central Question

2. Continuity Between Old and New Covenant

7. The Role of the Word of God

The Word must be internalized. Digital engagement alone often lacks the depth needed for long-term transformation.

8. Cultural and Technological Influence

Modern technology conditions believers toward distraction, reducing attention span and diminishing deep engagement with Scripture.

9. Spiritual Discernment

Believers must develop discernment through Scripture and the Holy Spirit to distinguish truth from deception.

10. The Priesthood of the Believer

Every believer is called to function as a priest, offering spiritual sacrifices and participating in sanctification.

11. Spiritual Sacrifices

True sacrifice involves surrendering desires and allowing God to completely remove sinful patterns, not merely managing them.
